## Graduation Steps

As I prepare this reflection, it is the week of my daughter Natasha's graduation from Chapman University in the City of Orange. I have flashbacks of taking a picture of Natasha with crayon still in hand, giving mother Nitaya a neck hug good-bye on her first day of kindergarten nearly 18 years ago and nearly 4 years ago, I took a parallel picture of Natasha on her first day in the university dorm, hugging mom with grayer hair, this time a cell phone in Natasha's hand in place of the crayon.

Beyond the warm nostalgia of seeing a little girl grow into a young woman, I paused a moment to reflect on the literal meaning of graduation. To that we need to know that it is tied to the word graduate as literally since the 15th century referring to "one who holds a degree" which through a series of etymological steps comes from the Latin word *gradus* "a step; a step climbed (on a ladder or stair);" figuratively "a step toward something, a degree of something rising by stages".

On June 1, we will also celebrate our annual Teacher Recognition and Graduate Sunday to acknowledge the nurture and educational ministries of our Sunday School teachers as well as recognize students in our church family in their academic achievements and milestones. I hope all of you will join us that day to share our gratitude and celebrate our children.

The beginning of summer in the liturgical Christian year also arrives soon after the Season of Easter

(Resurrection) as we remember the transition between the resurrected Christ and the beginning of the Church as the continuing "Body of Christ" in the world. It perhaps may be even be seen as a graduation of sorts as followers of Christ climb the next gradus step up to becoming who God intends us to be. The final Sunday in the Easter season is often observed as Ascension Sunday to remember when the resurrected Christ after 40 days with his disciples ascended into heaven (i.e. the sky). Now, that's what I call a graduation! The next step up!

Soon after that, the next big step for Jesus' followers was "graduation" to becoming the Church with the coming of the Holy Spirit mightily upon the disciples on the Day of Pentecost, often marked as the "birthday of the Church".

Now, I need to be careful not to draw too many parallels between these graduations of Jesus and the early Church to our own transition as we enter my final year as your pastor. After all, the only ascension into the sky that I will be making is when I depart entering a jet plane with a one-way ticket to retire in Honolulu (although some people do call Hawaii paradise). And in our church tradition, I ethically must remain "hands-off" with regard to who God calls into your next pastoral leadership. (Depending on your tradition or theological point of view, some Christian faiths regard St. Peter as Christ's explicit successor. In fact, the title "Vicar of Christ" given to the pope, the Archbishop of Rome, implies the pontiff's supreme and universal primacy, both of honor and of jurisdiction, over the Church of Christ.)

Nevertheless, I am excited by the opportunities to bring as many new

preachers into the MPCC pulpit as possible in my final year with you. It is by no means an audition for your next potential pastor. However, I do want to expose you to the kind of energy and vision that the next generation of pastoral leadership brings to the Church.

Isn't it exciting to envision the possibilities when we are open to the movement of the Holy Spirit? Let us prepare to take MPCC to the next level! It's graduation time!
