When Politics and Faith Collide

In the wake of immigration raids taking place not just in the City of Los Angeles, but also our own Montebello and neighboring cities of Downey, Pico Rivera, Alhambra and others, our communities have been struck with confusion, rage, and fear, disrupting the lives of families in our neighborhoods. Is there only one possible Christian response to such events? Can we seriously ask “What does God want in all of this?”

Let me share a portion of the reflection offered by Hawaii Conference Minister, David Popham, as he looked back at some of the respectful discussion that took place at the Hawaii Conference 'Aha Paeaina (cf. Annual Gathering) a couple weeks ago:

Speaking to Political Concerns
During the 'Aha Makua [business meeting], we took up debate and voted for the resolution to oppose the 2025 immigration roll backs. While all present seemed to be in favor of the actions called for by the resolution, there was concern for some of the language in the opening Summary paragraph which specifically names the current D.C. administration. The debate was cordial and passionate, as is typical of our debates. It cannot be said that the members of this Conference are anything less than passionate, and I continue to praise Ke Akua [God] for our deep connections to faith.

What struck me was that as we sought to speak spiritual truths to secular powers we were struggling with how to address a political issue without dipping into partisan politics. I can speak only from my perspective, but there was a moment or two when

comments were those of partisan politics. Some recognized this and sought to bring attention to it. Unfortunately, we have been so conditioned by society's rancorous public debates that we followed the same lines of division into this debate.

By these observations I don't seek to shame anyone. I simply seek to observe how politics continues to inform the church instead of faith informing politics. Political debate is based on establishing dominance and emerging the winner. Faithful conversations should be structured by grace and compassion in which the goal is mutual support, even in disagreement. If political debate is about getting our way, faithful debate is about getting God's way.

Of course, there are likely churches and pastors that are fully invested on one side or the other, not seeing eye-to-eye with each other. I imagine in those churches there may not be a lot of debate since they already “know” that they are on God’s side and God is on theirs. However, for a church like our dear Montebello Plymouth Church which the members show great love for one another, yet hold that in tension with disparate political views, we too, struggle with how to be faithful to God’s call to love and serve and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Let us endeavor to engage in respectful conversation, that “faithful debate (in Rev. Popham’s words), to engage in” toward getting God’s way, rather than political debate intent on getting our way. There is too much at stake for our intent is to win a political debate. Jesus, though victorious over death, in the world’s view might be seen as a loser: he aligned himself with losers, the poor, the powerless, the unclean, the sinners and

was arrested, tried, and executed as a traitor to the empire. How can we say that this is about winning? It is indeed about being faithful, which in the end may mean losing or at the very least conceding that what I “know and want” may not always be what God wants.

God, show us your wisdom and your ways! Show us your steadfast love that endures forever!


Join us for our church picnic on July 20 after our Worship Service. Our church boards will provide hotdogs, burgers, salad, and an ice cream bar.
