Death Before Life; Darkness Before Light

We are now in the second half of the season of Lent, the 40-day period of penitence and preparation for Easter in the Christian liturgical year.

I've mentioned before that the word "Lent" originates from the Old English word "lencten," meaning "springtime" or "lengthening of the days," referring to the increasing daylight hours that characterize the spring season. That is to say that originally, "Lent" had no religious connotation and simply referred to the season of spring. As Christianity developed, the period of Lent, a 40-day period of preparation for Easter, was named after the secular term "Lent", which was associated with the spring season.

As Easter approaches, we in the Northern hemisphere find ourselves surrounded by the signs of spring—trees budding, flowers blooming, and the world awakening from the grip of winter. This transformation in nature is a reflection of the deeper renewal we celebrate in Christ's resurrection. Just as spring brings new life, Easter proclaims the greatest renewal of all: the victory of life over death through Jesus Christ.

In the final week of Lent, which we observe as Holy Week, we especially look forward to welcoming

new members into the Montebello Plymouth family through the sacrament of baptism as well as affirmation of previous baptism, on the triumphant first day of Holy Week known as Palm/Passion Sunday (this year, April 13) as we commemorate the final week of Jesus' earthly ministry. During that week we also join with our sister church San Marino Congregational Church for joint Holy Week services: Maundy Thursday, April 17 at San Marino Congregational for 6 pm soup supper (They will provide!) and service at 7 pm; then Good Friday, April 18 at MPCC Fukushima Chapel for service at 7 pm.

Then on Easter morning, our Lenten journey through darkness ends with the celebration of Christ's resurrection to new life, the very meaning of the Easter mystery in our Resurrection Day celebration on Sunday, April 20 in the 10 am worship service.

Our broken world needs Easter more than ever. The Apostle Paul tells us that "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation is in vain and your faith is in vain. (1 Cor. 15:14). Our observance of the Resurrection at Easter is not just a mere recollection of the central events of Christianity—it is a life-giving sign of hope that is realized in our lives each and every year.

Each year we also are invited to renew that same miracle in our lives, as we journey with Christ in his passion, death, and resurrection. We are given the perseverance and grace we need for the true goal of our lives—to journey to Eternal Life.
