Moving into the New Year

As we gather in the gentle glow of Advent's light and look toward the promise of the New Year, I write to you with a heart full of both gratitude and a quiet sense of reflection. This Christmas marks my final year with you before I step into retirement, a transition that brings a flood of memories of our shared journey of faith.

In this time of year, our lectionary guides us to a profound, yet often overlooked, part of the Nativity story: the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt, as recorded in Matthew 2:13-23. It is a narrative that speaks not merely of a peaceful birth in a manger, but of the stark realities of fear, displacement, and divine providence in the face of human cruelty.

We often imagine the Christmas story as a static, serene painting. Yet, Matthew's account reminds us it was one of constant motion and peril. An angel appears to Joseph in a dream, urging him to flee the murderous intentions of King Herod. Mary, Joseph, and the infant Jesus become refugees, seeking safety in a foreign land. They were the original displaced family, a powerful testament to the vulnerability of even the Son of God.

This story of flight resonates deeply in our world today, where countless

families flee persecution, war, and hardship, seeking refuge and hope. The Holy Family's journey challenges us to see the face of Christ in the eyes of the stranger, the immigrant, and the asylum seeker. Their vulnerability calls us to a ministry of hospitality and compassion, to be the welcoming presence that the innkeeper in Bethlehem could not initially be.

As I reflect on our years together, I see the ways we have striven to embody this compassion. We have been a community that opens its doors, our hearts, and our resources to those in need. We have journeyed through joys and sorrows, through seasons of plenty and times of trial. Through it all, the steadfast love of God has been our guiding star.

Matthew's account concludes with the family's eventual return to Nazareth, fulfilling the prophecy, "Out of Egypt I called my son." It is a reminder that the trials and exiles we face are not the final word. The arc of the story bends towards homecoming and restoration. There is always the promise of a return to peace, a new beginning guided by God's hand.

As I prepare to conclude my active ministry among you, my prayer for you is that you continue to embrace the dynamism of the Christian life. Like the Holy Family, be ready to move when God calls, to embrace change, and to find the divine presence even in the most unexpected and challenging circumstances.

This Christmas, let us celebrate the

Incarnation not just as a historical event, but as a living truth—that God is with us, in our joys and in our flights, in our stability and in our transitions.

May the peace of the Christ Child be with you all now and in the New Year. I look forward to this final year of serving alongside you with gratitude.

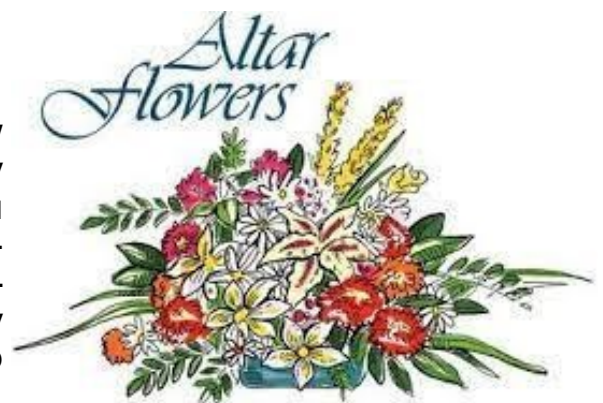
