us in the few days after all their buildings burned to the ground in the Eaton Canyon fire. We barely had opportunity to acknowledge the cancellation of the installation service of our new Conference Minister, the Rev. Rachael Pryor which we would have hosted on our MPCC campus the day before. Yet, Rev. Pryor was able to deliver a hopeful message about our oneness in Christ's baptism to both our congregations.

Yet with all the media attention (including NBC News, LA Times, Fox 11 LA, and among others), one standout moment was the Rev. Dr. Paul Tellström's interview with the LA Times from our back lot afforded this theodicy: Theodicy is the question of "Where is God when terrible things happen?" And so you would ask that very question naturally today when you see what's happened. But if you instead say, "Where is God?" God is in the eyes of the first responders who showed up and cut a path so that we could start to attack the fire. God is in those people who are standing by the side of the road who were giving out free water because they know people need it. God is in the responders who were keeping the buildings safe around so that people have

something to return to. And that is truly a vision of what it is to see God at work in the world. It's working through our hands because we are now Christ's hands on earth. We have the heart. We have the hands. And we have the will to make this a better place for everybody."

And as I prepare this pastor article we also prepare to inaugurate a new (old) President. Eight years ago, I quoted what comedian Dave Chappelle said at the end of this Saturday Night Live monologue on the Saturday immediately following the Presidential election of 2016: "...I'm wishing Donald Trump luck. And I'm going to give him a chance, and we, the historically disenfranchised, demand that he give us one too. Thank you very much."

Here eight years later, I again quote the ending of Dave Chappelle's Saturday Night Live monologue delivered 2 days before the inauguration: "Donald Trump, whether people voted for you or not, they're all counting on you, whether they like you or not, they're all counting on you. The whole world is counting on you. I mean this when I say this: 'Good luck'. Please, do better next time. Please, all of us, do better next time. Do not forget your humanity and please have empathy for displaced people whether they're in the Palisades or Palestine. Thank you very much..."
