Black History, Lent, and Seeing Good

Grace and peace to you in the name of the One who walks with us through the valley of the shadow of death. Today, we are at a profound, intersecting moment—the unfolding aftermath of a tragic injustice in our nation, the start of Black History Month, and the quiet beginning of the Lenten season. It is a time that calls us to deep reflection, honest lament, and renewed courageous action.

We hold in our prayers the family and loved ones of Renee Nicole Good, a mother, poet, and advocate who was shot and killed by a federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officer in Minneapolis on January 7, 2026. Renee was known as a woman of deep faith and compassion, remembered by her family as an "agent of peace" who cared for others throughout her life. She was acting as a community observer, standing in solidarity with neighbors, when she was killed. Her death has sparked national outcry, highlighting ongoing, urgent questions about justice, human dignity, and the use of force in our communities.

It is particularly poignant that we

bring her name into our consciousness during Black History Month. Black history is not just about the past; it is a living, breathing, and sometimes painful present. Renee's story reminds us that the fight for justice, equality, and the protection of vulnerable neighbors is continuous. Her life stands within the lineage of Christian witness, summoning us to be present with the oppressed, not merely in prayer but with our actions.

So, as a community of faith, we are called to:
Lament: We mourn the loss of a life dedicated to kindness.

Stand for Justice: We honor the memory of all who have questioned structures that protect power at the expense of the vulnerable, who have demanded accountability, and who have striven for a world where all are safe.

Celebrate the "Good": We are encouraged to hold fast to what is good—to compassion, peace, and love—even in the face of fear and division.

Let us use this Black History Month to look deeper into the stories of our neighbors, to stand against state violence, and to work for a "Beloved Community" where everyone is valued.

May the legacy of Renee Good inspire us to live with compassion, and may we continue to build a world where all come home safe to the people we love.

MPCC's General Fund

The Summer Ex Fund provides scholarships for families who are not able to cover the registration fees.
