The "why" behind every transition may not always be understood, but rest assured in God's plan and timing.

Let this final year be filled with intention and love. Continue to gather, worship, serve, and "Strive for full restoration, encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you." Continue building on the established foundation of faith, knowing that labor in the Lord is never in vain.

It is exciting to share this final chapter and to see how God continues to shape and guide our MPCC family in the coming years.

MPCC's General Fund

The General Fund takes care of the basic day-to-day operations of our church as well as furthering the mission of our church as a whole. Annual pledges (tithes) help the trustees estimate how to distribute and budget our expenses on a monthly and yearly basis. The Summer Ex Fund provides scholarships for families who are not able to cover the registration fees. Both are separate from MPCC's General Fund and checks should be written separate from your regular offering.
