## Unprecedented November Gratitude

*"Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's."*

**Matthew 22:21**

Writing a pastor's article in mid-October for a November church newsletter also provides a context for reflecting on the transition from October to November. And this October, unlike previous Octobers, I would venture to say that most of you have already voted (or at least I hope you have) in our national and local elections.

As this newsletter is distributed near the end of October, some of you may be reading this in early November. It is possible (likely?) that the results of the American Presidential election will have already been announced. And whichever candidate has been declared the winner, I pray for their health, strength, and wisdom for the long road ahead. As much as we have been bracing ourselves to the outcome of this Presidential election, dreading the possibility of violent clashes between groups opposing the results, for now we can hopefully, at least for ourselves, take a posture that will carry us through in whatever happens. I am suggesting that we carry ourselves with an unprecedented level of gratitude.

When Jesus found himself confronted with the insincere flattery of two opposing groups (Pharisees and Herodians) asking him to settle an argument with regard to the relationship between civic responsibility and religious purity, i.e.,

whether it was lawful to pay taxes to the emperor or not, his ingenious response was to show that their coins bore the image of the emperor and then declared "Give to the emperor what is the emperor's, and to God what is God's."

Can we be thankful that, despite its flaws, we live in a nation that has demonstrated great moments of welcome and inclusion, where people can express differences of opinions and faith perspectives and still hold one another as proud Americans? Can we be grateful for the fair share of taxes we contribute for the betterment of everyone?

In a month that begins with All Saints Day (Nov. 1) celebrating and honoring all the saints (believers), both living and those gone before us, we can carry a posture of unprecedented gratitude for the lives of all the faithful who have shaped who we are and who we are becoming. In a month in which our local churches invite us to reflect on Jesus' declaration to "Give to God the things that are God's" on Stewardship Sunday (Nov. 8), when we in faith commit finances to our local church budgets for the coming year, we can carry a posture of unprecedented gratitude towards the many blessings with which God has sustained us and our families. who have survived and thrived during this season of pandemic as well as praise God for all who have worked so hard trying to keep us fed, safe and healthy.

Let us all feast, wherever we may be, on the bounty of God's blessings, with an unprecedented sense of gratitude for the days and years ahead!

Dear Church Family,

Sorry I have not written in a long time. Hope everyone is well. A lot has changed since the last time I reported any Diaconate news.

There are a few things that have come up that I would like bring to your attention.

**First**, I believe the biggest question looming on everyone's mind is when the church can reopen and we can attend church again. We all know it will be a while for things to go back to normal but that does not mean we cannot try to at least do a safe partial reopening, especially for those who do not have virtual access or simply just want to get out a bit.

Pastor Mitchell is considering doing an extra modified outdoor service at 9:00 AM if there are enough folks who would like to attend.
